**Keynote Title:**"The Psychological Effects of COVID-19 Pandemic"

# **ABSTRACTS**

### SENSE OF 'PLACE' AND PLACE ATTACHMENT REGARDING CHILDREN

#### **Abstract**

This review, embraced within the theories of environmental psychology, consists of a comprehensive literature review on the concepts of 'sense of place' and 'place attachment' in the related extent regarding children. According to the studies of environmental psychologists the interaction between human and place is unstable and reciprocal. Thus, constituting an integrative perspective is required to formulate more accurate discussion to examine the understanding of place and place attachment though children's perception. Therefore, in the first part of this review, environmental psychology and its scope as a theoretical approach is discussed before scrutinizing the concepts of 'sense of place' with the relation of 'understanding of space'. Within this context, meaning of place is considered to be directly related with the experiences of human beings. In other words, place is considered not only a built physical environment but a changeable and interactive perceptual production. Such a debate on the physical space brings the discussion to the concept of 'place attachment' and its necessity for humans. Multifaced structure of the concept of place attachment is attempted to be explained briefly before the last part of the review which sets out children's place attachment leanings through certain studies and an intended future case study.
